

Course Description

ENL2012 | English Literature 1 | 3.00 credits

A survey of major British writers from Chaucer through the 18th century. Required of English majors. Prerequisites: ENC 1101, 1102 or equivalent.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will apply an understanding of literary genres by:

- 1. Understanding literary terms.
- 2. Evaluating terms and particular elements of specific literary genres.
- 3. Evaluating the aesthetic qualities of the assigned material.

Competency 2: The student will analyze selected readings by:

- 2. Analyzing and discussing particular conflicts, ideas, and experiences in the literary works.
- 3. Evaluating the literary work from a critical perspective.

Competency 3: The student will value an appreciation for the importance of literature in culture by:

- 1. Summarizing key writers and literary works from the Middle Ages to the 18th century.
- 2. Summarizing literary movements from the Middle Ages to the 18th century.
- 3. Analyzing the literary works' societal and historical contexts.

Competency 4: The student will create artifacts that demonstrate proficiency in written communication by:

- 1. Creating, developing, organizing, and presenting ideas effectively.
- 2. Supporting and including communication to purpose, audience, and occasion.
- 3. Applying the conventions of standard American English.
- 4. Applying correct use of citing primary and secondary sources.
- 5. Analyzing and evaluating the text.
