

Course Description

ENL2022 | English Literature 2 | 3.00 credits

A survey of major British writers from the 18th century through the contemporary period. Required of English majors. Prerequisites: ENC1101, 1102.

Course Competencies:

- 2. Summarizing literary movements from the 18th century to the contemporary period
- 3. Analyzing the literary works' societal and historical contexts.

- 1. Creating, developing, organizing, and presenting ideas effectively.
- 2. Supporting and including communication o purpose, audience, and occasion.
