

Course Description

ITA1120 | Elementary Italian 1 | 4.00 credits

In this course, students will develop appropriate proficiency in interpersonal, interpretive, and presentational modes at the novice mid-level in Italian. Note: Students must pass this course with a C or better to continue to ITA1121.

Competency 1: The student will engage in interpersonal and presentational communication using practiced words, phrases, and sentences by:

- 1. Greeting, introducing, and providing basic information about themselves and others.
- 2. Asking and answering simple questions about familiar topics.
- 3. Presenting information on everyday life, activities, and familiar subjects.
- 4. Expressing likes and dislikes.
- 5. Reciting short, memorized phrases or rhymes.

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate presentational writing and interpretive reading skills by:

- 1. Labeling familiar objects, people, and places in pictures or posters.
- 2. Writing about themselves using learned words, phrases, and sentences.
- 3. Filling out simple forms with basic personal information.
- 4. Recognizing words, phrases, and characters in context with visual aids.
- 5. Connecting written words and phrases to their meanings in familiar contexts.

Competency 3: The student will develop interpretive listening skills and explore traditions through communication by:

- 1. Recognizing familiar words, phrases, and courtesy expressions.
- 2. Understanding basic information in memorized words and phrases.
- 3. Listening to conversations and watching video clips of various situations.
- 4. Identifying common products related to home and community life.
- 5. Recognizing simple patterns of behavior in familiar settings.
