

Course Description

MUL1010 | Music Appreciation | 3.00 credits

In this course, students will survey the history of classical music from antiquity to the modern period, focusing on western music. The curriculum may also integrate a variety of popular and global styles where appropriate. Student learning outcomes: students will discuss and analyze music using terminology appropriate for the course; students will demonstrate fundamental knowledge of the works of significant composers; students will identify connections between music and the other arts; and students will identify historical styles and periods based on instruments and performance practices utilized.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will be able to demonstrate knowledge of the essential elements of the music by:

- 1. Identifying and defining the elements.
- 2. Applying knowledge of the elements to various listening activities and performances.

Competency 2: The student will be able to demonstrate knowledge of basic music terminology by:

- 1. Identifying and defining the terminology.
- 2. Applying knowledge of terms through descriptions of live or recorded performances.

Competency 3: The student will be able to demonstrate an understanding of various musical styles by:

- 1. Identifying and describing conventions from different historical periods.
- 2. Identifying and describing conventions from different cultures.

Competency 4: The student will be able to demonstrate a comprehension of the techniques and methods used by collaborative artists in music by:

- 1. Identifying and describing techniques used by the composer, conductor, and performers.
- 2. Relating this knowledge to a performance experience.

Competency 5: The student will demonstrate knowledge of music literature by:

- 1. Connecting significant works and their composers.
- 2. Relating significant works to their historical periods.
- 3. Matching significant works to their various cultures.

Competency 6: The student will be able to demonstrate an understanding of the listener's role in music by:

1. Identifying appropriate audience etiquette.
